It is something between a church and small group, a simple way to gather for fellowship, focusing on regular rhythms and practices. As a community we will gather every other week for singing, prayer, sharing, and reading scripture, followed up by a fellowship meal and communion. We will host and organize bi-monthly community events that will mainly be social and relational in nature. We will host bi-monthly afternoon worship services, networking with others out of the region. Dave has been working out the details and putting the concept onto paper. It has been gratifying to finally have some more clarity about what we are doing and are excited about the development of an expression of church that can be replicated by others. Rebekka continues to pour her heart and soul into the Villa, the community center that we started in 2021. People of all walks of life come and use the space be they rich or poor, locals or migrants, families or seniors. We are amazed at the eagerness and openness for people to connect and contribute and we see how hospitality and community is a meaningful way to minister to people.
