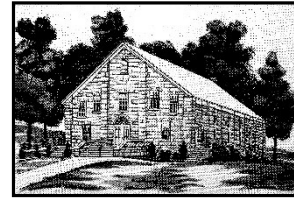

This covers the train and rail bike trip as well as transportation (van.) If you choose to drive your own vehicle, the ticket price is \$80. There is a 2 hour layover in Frostburg where you can buy food. Not a biker? Never fear! The bikes sit on the train tracks, hold 4 riders, and several will be connected, so we will mix up stronger peddlers with those less able. The rail bike trip is primarily down the mountain, but there is some peddling required for the last mile to the Cumberland Station. Buy your ticket from Sandi in the church office.
